INTERNATIONAL APPLICATION PROCESS

The applications for international students will be reviewed after all of the following steps are completed and the \$50 application fee has been received.

STEP 1

Complete online application and submit \$50 application fee.

STEP 2

Log in to your SchoolAdmin profile to complete the Admissions Checklist

STEP 3

After an online application and all documents have been received, the International Admissions Officer will contact you to schedule an interview.

STEP 4

Students will be notified of admission decision via phone or email within two weeks of interview.

STEP 5

Within 10 days of admission decision notification, students must complete the Enrollment form and submit the enrollment fee online.

STEP 6

Once the enrollment fee has been paid, the International Admissions Officer will mail the student their I-20. For transfer students, Orange Lutheran's I-20 will be issued after the student's SEVIS record is released from their current school.

A majority of our students are from China and South Korea (over 80%). We also have students from Turkey, Mexico, Vietnam, and Canada.

Does Orange Lutheran accept spring enrollment for International Students?

When do International Students take the placement test? This varies based on their acceptance date.

There are scheduled placement test dates, however, if students are traveling from outside the country, it can be offered prior to the start of the school year.

I-20's are issued to applicants who meet the following admissions criteria, which allows students to apply for a F-1 student visa.





AGE REQUIREMENT

Students must be at least 14 years of age to be eligible to enroll at the start of their freshman year. Student must graduate prior to the age of 20.



ENGLISH PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT FOR ADMISSION

One of the following is required:

TOEFL iBT - minimum score of 73

TOEFL Jr. - minimum score of 800

iTEP SLATE - minimum score of 4.3

IELTS - minimum score of 6.0

Duolingo English Test - minimum score of 95



HOMESTAY REQUIREMENT

All international students are required to find a homestay if not living with a parent or guardian over the age of 25 in the U.S.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT

Orange Lutheran does not offer an English as a Second Language (ESL) program, therefore, the international students are expected to know English well enough to handle all classes without any special assistance or modifications. However, all international students must take an English Language Development (ELD) course. This class is taken in conjunction with their English class during their first year.
